17:29 **Donald G:** So freelancers tend to be careful in placing bids on project, as placing bids on a project does not guarantee that the project will be awarded to them.

17:30 **Margus Meigo:** Oh, did not know that. Of-course most of them have professional as it is easy to pay for that as long they get even few clients per month it is worth. Well, i guess they use then thousands of accounts or something maybe.,

17:31 **Margus Meigo:** yes but if they use their network of bidders, 30 people, or 200 accounts working in together, then they can do a lot of damage.. but in the end, they use some kind of automatic scripts, one program it self has told methat

17:31 **Margus Meigo:** i was thinking, maybe give some ideas, how to stop the automatic bidders

17:31 **Margus Meigo:** You know as it will bring quality down,

17:31 **Donald G:** There are no such bidders.

17:32 **Donald G:** When a freelancer places a bid, they are given limited number of characters when they type in their proposals.

17:33 **Margus Meigo:** well, not at same time, , they use algorithm or human logic, of what accounts bid how much per moth i guess, as it is , one thing is Clear, the NOT reading on what they bidding on

17:33 **Donald G:** Also, users are required to have their identities and addresses. For that, they submit IDs and documents to have their individual identities verified.

17:33 **Margus Meigo:** As basically i saw lot of time to write complete instructions, on what to bid, and when One starts chat with me, they have no idea what i told and ask instructions

17:34 **Margus Meigo:** Yes in asia country's people work together, to get ID s and addresses for hundreds of fake accounts are Easy job

17:34 **Donald G:** Failure to undergo such verifications will limit a user's further access to certain features in the site.

17:34 **Margus Meigo:** Anyway, so would some Captha stop the automatic scripts for bidding ?

17:35 **Margus Meigo:** (the profiles that use scripts have more then 10 verified reviews usually)

17:36 **Donald G:** We are saddened if you see it that way, but our Verifications team is so keen processing identity verifications.

17:36 **Margus Meigo:** one true programmer just complain, that as soon as better platform comes they will go away, but they have to use this for now as it is most popular still, but they told also, that fake bidders trashing nearly all bids

17:37 **Donald G:** We are saddened that such negative assumptions are attributed to the site, but we understand where those fears come from.

17:38 **Margus Meigo:** it is not assumption, it is first hand experience, and feedback from programmers who have been working here, using Your services more then 10 years

17:44 **Donald G:** Most of them initiate conversations with their prospective freelancers before they decide whom to award their projects to. They tend to make sure that the account owner is as they introduce themselves.
